Pygmalion My Fair Lady is based on the George Bernard Shaw play, Pygmalion. The title comes from a legendary Greek figure, Pygmalion, a sculptor who fell in love with a statue he carved. Learn more about the myth of Pygmalion and Galatea and other Greek myths.

Film Fest Many modern movies are based on the story of Pygmalion. Screen one or more of these movies with your residents: *Pretty Woman, Pinocchio, She's All That, Trading Places, Ruby Sparks* or *Overboard*. Discuss the similarities and differences.



Afternoon Tea Host a proper British afternoon tea. Share the history of the



English custom. Gather your residents to create some traditional <u>tea</u> <u>time recipes</u>. Someone might even have a special tea set to use for the occasion.

Horse Races Eliza's first outing in high society occurs at the Ascot horse races. In the United States, the Kentucky Derby horse race is held in early May. Gather your residents together for a viewing party. Place "bets" and cheer for your favorites.

Flowers In the beginning of *My Fair Lady*, Eliza sells bunches of flowers and dreams of someday working in a real flower shop. Celebrate the beauty of flowers by visiting a farmers market or local florist shop with your residents, or arrange to have a variety of flowers brought to your community. Give your residents the opportunity to create their own unique bouquets.



Fascinators One of the fun traditions associated with both the Kentucky Derby and Ascot is the wearing of original hats and hair pieces. Gather materials together and have residents and staff create their own unique and beautiful fascinators.
