

Halloween Crafts

Lollipop Spider

Materials:

2 black pipe cleaners
1 lollipop
2 googly
eyes Glue

**Directions:**

Cut pipe cleaners in half so you have 4 pieces. Wrap each piece once around the lollipop stick, leaving equal lengths on both sides, to form the 8 legs of the spider. Slightly bend the end of each leg. Glue googly eyes to the body.

Halloween Canvas

Materials:

2 small rectangular canvases
Acrylic paint (Green, white, black, orange)
Paintbrushes

**Directions:**

Paint one canvas green, one white, and one orange. Use black paint to add facial features for a skeleton, a monster, and a pumpkin. Display together.

Candy Corn Banner

Materials:

Paper plates
Yellow and orange paint
Paintbrush
Scissors
Ribbon or twine



Directions:

Paint the outside of the plate orange. The pattern on the plate makes a good guide and helps to make nice, even circles. Let the orange paint dry before painting the inside circle yellow. Leave the center of the plate white. When the paint is dry, cut the plate in half. Then cut the halves in half again and then the quarters in half. You should have 8 equal pieces that look like candy corn. Tape the candy corn pieces to the twine to form the banner.

Felt Pumpkin Faces

Materials:

Cardboard Circle
Felt (orange, black, green)
Small Box
Scissors



Directions:

Cut your orange felt circle a little larger than the cardboard circle. Cut small slits around the circle (about every inch or so). Hot glue the orange felt to the cardboard circle overlapping the slits. Cut out a stem shape from the green felt and hot glue it to the top. Cut out a variety of simple shapes for the pumpkins eyes, mouth, nose, eyebrows, etc. If desired add accessories, such as sunglasses, bows, hair, etc. Have fun changing the face.

Batty Pin

Materials:

Bow tie pasta
Black pompom (small)
Googly eyes (small)
Black spray paint
Hot glue
Jewelry pin (or magnet)



Directions:

Spray the pasta noodles black. Hot glue the eyes to the pom-pom and the pom-pom to the top of the pasta. Glue pin (or magnet) to the back of the pasta.

Calaveras Mask

Materials:

Paper plate
Pencil
Scissors
Craft sticks
Markers
Tape
Embellishments (if desired)



Directions:

Following the curve of the paper plate, draw the skull shape with a pencil. Use a black marker to draw two large ovals for the eyes and an upside-down heart for the nose. Use black marker to draw the mouth of your calavera along the vertical ridges of the paper plate. Using colored markers, decorate the calavera with symmetrical designs. If desired, add embellishments.

Candy Corn Button Art

Materials:

Yellow, Orange and White

Buttons Burlap

8" x 10" frame

Hot glue gun

Acrylic Paint in yellow, orange and white

Paintbrush

Mod Podge



Directions:

Glue the burlap to the back of the frame. Trim the edges of burlap. Draw an outline of a candy corn on the burlap. Paint in the sections of your candy corn with acrylic paint. Let dry. Glue white, yellow, and orange buttons to the corresponding section on the candy corn. Place back in frame.

Mummy Centerpiece

Materials:

Mason jar

Strips of gauze

Mod Podge

Sponge brush

Googly eyes

Glue

Candle



Directions:

Lightly cover the Mason jar with Mod Podge. Starting from the top and working toward the bottom, wrap gauze around the Mason jar. Glue googly eyes to the jar. Put a candle inside the jar

Rock Ghosts

Materials:

Rocks of various shapes
White spray paint
Black Sharpie



Directions:

Spray paint rocks white. Let dry. Use black Sharpie to draw a ghost face.

Monster Magnet

Materials:

8 craft sticks
Green and black paint
White paper
Black sharpie
Cardboard
Glue
Magnet



Directions:

Measure and cut a piece of cardboard slightly smaller than 7 craft sticks. Cover it with glue and stick 7 craft sticks on top. Flip it over and glue a single craft stick across the body.

On the front, draw the outline of Frankenstein's hair and paint it with black paint as well as his bolts. Paint the rest of the craft sticks with green paint. Once the paint is completely dry, draw on a mouth, nose, and some stitches. Cut out ovals from white paper and color the pupils with black sharpie. Glue magnet to the back.

Sock Black Cat

Materials:

Black sock
Scissors
Poly-fill
Black and white thread
Needle
2 buttons

Felt Glue



Directions:

Cut the top of sock in an arc creating pointy cat ears. Stuff full of Poly-fill, then whip-stitch the opening closed. Glue on button eyes and a felt nose. Stitch in some whiskers with white thread. Tie a ribbon around the neck.

Ghost Garland

Materials:

Styrofoam balls
Cheesecloth
Black and white brads
String
Scissors



Directions:

Cut out a square of folded cheesecloth that will evenly surround the Styrofoam ball. Pull the cheesecloth around the edges to stretch it out and make it look gauzy. Then push two black brads into the wrapped Styrofoam ball to look like eyes and to hold the cheesecloth in place. Pull apart the two prongs of a white brad and wrap them around the string. Push the prongs back together and then pierce the top of the ghost with the brad to connect the ghost to the string.

Milk Jug Ghosts

Materials:

Clean gallon milk jug
Black permanent marker
Knife
Small battery



Directions:

Draw ghost eyes and mouths on the jugs. Cut a small hole in the bottom of the jug & put battery candles inside.

Tin Can Frankie

Materials:

Clean tin can
Green spray paint
Black felt
Bottle cap
Screws
Googly eyes
Hot glue gun
Black marker



Directions:

Spray the can and bottle cap green. Cut felt and glue to the top of the can for hair. Glue googly eyes and nose to can to form the face. Use sharpie to draw mouth and scars. Put screws on either side of the neck.

Wine Bottle Pumpkin

Materials:

Wine bottle
Orange spray paint
Black Sharpie
Ribbon



Directions:

Spray lower part of the bottle orange. Leave the neck of the bottle green. Use black Sharpie to draw a face. Tie ribbon to the top.

Glue Ghosts

Materials:

White school glue
Wax paper
Googly eyes



Directions:

Place a piece of waxed paper on a flat surface. Squeeze glue from the bottle into the shape of a ghost. Place googly eyes into the glue. Let dry overnight. Once the ghosts dry, carefully peel them from paper and use them as decoration.
